RESOLVES

OF THE

SEVENTEENTH LEGISLATURE

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE,

PASSED AT THE SESSION

WHICH COMMENCED ON THE FOURTH DAY OF JANUARY, AND ENDED ON THE THIRTIETH
DAY OF MARCH, IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-SEVEN.

Gun Houses in East Machias and Calais, either at public or private sale ; and the nett proceeds of the sales shall be paid into the Treasury of the State.

RESOLVED, That the Acting Quarter Master General be, and he hereby is authorized to exchange the lots of land on which the State's Gun Houses now stand, in the towns of East Machias and Calais, for other lots, and to execute a legal transfer of the State's right to said land, if, in his opinion, such exchange would be for the interest of the State.

Chapter 62.

Resolve authorizing the Treasurer of the County of Washington to borrow money on the faith of said County.

Approved March 29, 1837.

RESOLVED, That the Treasurer of the County of Washington, be and he hereby is authorized to negotiate a loan, on the faith and responsibility of said County, not exceeding Two Thousand Dollars, to meet the current expenses of said County :—and this Resolve shall be in force one year and no longer.

Chapter 63.

Resolves authorizing the distribution of the first Report of the Geology of Maine.

Approved March 29, 1837.

RESOLVED, That there shall be copies of the First Report of the Geological Survey of Maine distributed in the following manner—viz:—Twelve copies to the Governor of the State. One copy to each member of the Council, Senate and House of Representatives. One copy to the Secretary of the State, Treasurer, Land Agent and Adjutant General. One copy to the Secretary, Assistant Secretary and Messengers of the Senate. One copy

to the Clerk, Assistant Clerk and the Messengers of the House of Representatives. One hundred copies of the Report, and fifty copies of the Plates to the Governor and Council to be by them distributed. Two copies to each of the Colleges in the State. One copy to the Theological Institution at Bangor, one copy to each of the incorporated Literary Institutions and Academies in the State. One copy to the Maine Medical School. One copy to the Maine Historical Society. One copy to the Maine Institute of Natural Science. One copy to each of the incorporated Agricultural Societies in the State. Twelve copies to the Geological Surveyor. Three copies to each of his Assistants, and three to the Draftsman. Five copies to the Library of the State. One copy to each of the Clerks in the several Departments of this State. One copy to the Executive of each of the States in the Union. One copy to each of the Colleges in New England except those in this State. One copy to the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. One copy to the Antiquarian Society in Worcester, (Mass.) Two copies to the Library of the United States. One copy with the Plates to the Surveyor General of this State. One copy with the Plates to each Chaplain of the Senate and House of Representatives.

RESOLVED, That two copies of the Report and one copy of the Plates shall be distributed to each of the cities, towns, and organized plantations, and the remainder of the edition of Reports and Plates shall be equally divided among the Senators and Representatives to be by them distributed among the people in their several school districts or otherwise, according to their discretion.

Chapter 64.

Resolve in favor of William Anson.

Approved March 29, 1837.

RESOLVED, That the Governor and Council be and they hereby are authorized to audit the account of William Anson for Survey of the St. Croix River, and the Governor is authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for such sum as may appear equitably due to said William Anson for said survey.
