#### Chapter 65. 20 de

Resolve in favor of Samuel W. Cole.

Approved March 29, 1837.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State to Samuel W. Cole the sum of Twenty-seven Dollars and Fifty Cents, in full for publishing the Laws of the State for 1836 and also for publishing an "Act to prohibit agencies for Banks out of the State, private Banking, and to regulate private Banks and Banking."

## Chapter 66.

An additional Resolve for the payment of Accounts against the State.

Approved March 29, 1837.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid from the Treasury of the State, out of moneys not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons, cities, towns and plantations mentioned in the Additional Roll of Accounts, No. 18, the sums set against the names of such persons, cities, towns and plantations respectively, amounting in the whole to the sum of Six Thousand Seven Hundred, Twenty-six Dollars and Seventy-two Cents,—in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they refer.
