Chapter 67.

Resolve providing for an examination into the doings of the York Bank.

Approved March 30, 1827.

RESOLVED, That Jonathan Burr of Brewer in the County of Penobscot, Meshach Humphrey of Gray and Nathan C. Fletcher of Thomaston, be a Committee to examine into the doings of the York Bank, in the town of Saco as it regards its agencies, issues, circulation, loans and other business; and more especially, into the truth of certain charges, made by Barnabas Palmer against said Bank in his letters to the Bank Commissioners, dated November 17th, and 27th, 1836, now on file in the Senate. And said Committee, shall proceed to this investigation as soon as may be after the close of the present session of the Legislature: and shall have power to examine all the books and papers of said Bank, and persons under oath. And make report of their doings, and the result of their investigation, to the Governor and Council, and forward a copy thereof, to the Secretary of State: who shall forthwith publish the same in the State paper. And said Committee shall be paid for their services, at the rate of Four Dollars per day; to be allowed by the Governor and Council—and the Governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrants on the Treasurer for the same.

Chapter 68.

Resolves authorizing further appropriations for continuing the Geological Survey of the State.

Approved March 30, 1837.

RESOLVED, That the Governor with the advice of Council is hereby authorized to employ some suitable person or persons to continue the Geological Survey of the State, at a salary not exceeding One Thousand Dollars.

RESOLVED, That the sum of Three Thousand Dollars be appropriated from the Treasury of the State, subject to the discretion of the Governor and Council and to be expended in continuing said Geological Survey.
