Chapter 304.

AN ACT supplementary to an act entitled "An additional Act regulating the admission

Chapter 306.

AN ACT additional to an Act for the due regulation of weights and measures.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That the sealers of weights and measures, who may hereafter be ap-Fees of seelers pointed in the several towns and cities in this State, of weights and in pursuance of the provisions of the is additional, shall be entitled to demand and receive, for trying and proving by said town and city standards, and sealing as in said act is provided, the following fees, to wit: Four cents for each beam, weight and measure found to be not conformable to said standards —and two cents for each beam, weight and measure found to be conformable thereto—said fees to be paid by the person or persons whose weights, measures and beams shall be compared as aforesaid.
