SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted, That this Act*—when to take effect.

Chapter 318.

AN ADDITIONAL ACT authorizing Attorneys in the Court of Common Pleas to practice law in the Supreme Judicial Court in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That all persons Persons admitted to practice law in C. C. Pleas may practice in S. J. Court in all cases.
who have been or may hereafter be admitted to practice law in the Court of Common Pleas, of regular standing at the bar of said Court, are hereby authorized to conduct, manage and argue, all cases both of law and fact in the Supreme Judicial Court, any law or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

Chapter 319.

AN ACT additional to an Act to regulate the taking of Alewives at Neguasset Falls in the town of Woolwich.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That* Alewives not to be taken in Neguasset Stream in the town of Woolwich upon certain days.
from and after the passing of this act, no person shall be allowed to take any of the fish called Alewives, by net or otherwise in Neguasset Stream in said town of Woolwich, on any other days than Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, in each week, and any person or persons who shall take fish in said stream other than on the days as aforesaid, he or they shall Penalties.
forfeit and pay, for every fish so unlawfully taken, a fine not exceeding ten cents nor less than three cents, and also be liable to forfeit their nets.
