the Constitution and laws of the United States, may appoint an Agent to demand and receive of the Executive authority of any other State, any fugitive from justice, charged with treason, felony, or other crime in this State; and the accounts of such Agent shall be audited by the Governor and Council and paid from the Treasury.

Governor authorized in certain cases to appoint agent to demand and receive fugitives from justice.
Agent's acc'ts, how audited and paid.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That when a demand shall be made upon the Executive authority of this State by the Executive of any other State, in any case authorized by the Constitution and laws of the United States, for the delivery over of any fugitive from justice, charged in such State with treason, felony, or other crime, and the Governor shall be satisfied, on investigation of the grounds of such demand, and that the same is made conformable to law and ought to be complied with, he shall issue his warrant under the seal of the State, authorizing the Agent, who may make such demand, either forthwith, or at such time as shall be designated in the warrant, to take and transport such person to the line of this State at the expense of such Agent, and shall also, by such warrant, require the civil officers within this State to afford all needful assistance in the execution thereof.

Authorized to aid agents from other states.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from and after the same shall have been approved by the Governor; and that "An Act providing for the appointment of Agents for demanding fugitives from justice" be and the same is hereby repealed.

Act when to take effect—former act repealed.

Chapter 331.

AN ACT additional to the several Acts for the better regulation and management of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That the

Indian Agent shall issue to the several Indians who have had or may have their land surveyed and designated on the plans as contemplated by the Acts to which this is additional, certificates of said survey and description of said lot in substance as follows:

Indian Agent to issue certificate of survey in certain cases.

Form of certificate.

Know all men by these presents that I, ———, Agent for the Penobscot tribe of Indians, have caused to be surveyed and set off to ——— his portion of the land on the Islands in the Penobscot river belonging to said tribe of Indians, as contemplated by the Acts of the Legislature of the State of Maine, bounded and described as follows: —————

To have and to hold the same as contemplated by the Acts aforesaid, with all the privileges conferred by said Acts.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal as Agent of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians this ——— day of ——— in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ———

Agent of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians.

Penobscot Indians prohibited from leasing land without consent of Agent.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That it shall not be in the power of any Indian of the said Penobscot Tribe to lease his or her lot of land for any term unless permitted by the Agent.

Chapter 332.

AN ACT authorizing Manufacturing Corporations to redeem lands sold on Execution and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That whenever any right, title, or interest in lands, tenements or hereditaments of any manufacturing corporation already established, or which may hereafter be established in this State, shall be taken in execution and sold at public auction in the manner provided by

Manufacturing Corporations authorized to redeem real estate sold on execution in certain cases.
