AN ACT authorizing Manufacturing Corporations to redeem lands sold on Execution and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That whenever any right, title, or interest in lands, tenements or hereditaments of any manufacturing corporation already established, or which may hereafter be redeem real es-established in this State, shall be taken in execution ecution in cer- and sold at public auction in the manner provided by

law, the corporation whose lands, tenements and hereditaments or any right, title or interest therein is so taken and sold, shall have the right of redeeming the How redeemed. same within the same time, and in such manner, and with like remedies to compel a reconveyance in case of payment or tender of payment of the sum for which the same was sold and interest thereon, as is provided in cases of equities of redemption of real estate mort-gaged.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the right of Right of redempredemption herein given may be attached on mesne attached. process and taken and sold on execution and the avails thereof disposed of in the same way, with the same right to the corporation from which the property is taken to redeem the same, within the same time and in like manner and with like remedies to compel a reconveyance in case of payment or tender of payment of the sum for which the same was sold and interest thereon, as is provided in cases of equities of redemption.

Chapter 333.

AN ACT additional to "An Act respecting mortgages and the rights in equity of redemption."

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That Proceedings to in all cases of mortgages of real estate, in addition to foreclose mortthe modes now provided by law for foreclosing the same, the mortgagee or his assigns may give public Mortgage to give notice of innotice, in some newspaper printed in the County, tention to forewhere said real estate is situated, of his claim by mortgage to such real estate, and that the condition in the same has been broken, by reason whereof he claims to foreclose such mortgage, which notice shall be published three weeks successively in such newspaper; or ensuch mortgagee or his assigns may cause a notice of
