Chapter 410.

AN ACT in addition to an Act to incorporate the St. Croix Navigation Company.

Approved February 22, 1838.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That the St. Croix Navigation Company may have the same powers, rights and immunities, between the outlet of Chepatnecook Lake and the Lakes and waters at the extreme head of Monument Stream, that they now have by virtue of their Act of Incorporation, between the termini mentioned in said Act—and they shall be subject to all the liabilities, limitations and restrictions as are in said Act specified.

Powers and liabilities.

Chapter 411.

AN ACT to authorize Moses Woodman and others to sell the old Baptist Meeting House in New Gloucester, and the land attached to the same.

Approved February 22, 1838.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That Moses Woodman, David Allen, Amos Haskell, Otis C. Gross and Samuel True, proprietors of the old Baptist Meeting House in New Gloucester, in common with others, be and they hereby are authorized and empowered to sell said Meeting House and the land attached to the same, either at Public Auction or private sale.

Proprietors.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That previous to the time of such sale, said Woodman, Allen, Haskell, Gross and True shall cause an appraisal to be made by three discreet persons, who are not proprietors, of the relative value of the pews in said House, and also of the value of the land attached to the same; and the proceeds of said sale, after deducting necessary expenses, and paying all debts due for the repairs of said

Appraisal to be made of pews.

House which have accrued, shall be divided among the proprietors of the pews in proportion to their appraisal.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted*, That in case any proprietor or proprietors of said House do not call for his or their proportion of the proceeds of said sale, within six months after the same shall have been made, it shall be the duty of said persons hereby authorized to sell said House and land, to give public notice, in some newspaper printed in Portland, therein stating said House and land have been sold, and that they are ready to pay over to any person or persons interested, his or their share of the proceeds of such sale.

Chapter 412.

AN ACT additional to "an Act to incorporate the Magurawock and Schoodic Canal Company."

Approved February 22, 1838.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That a further time of two years, from and after the time specified in and by an Act of the Legislature of this State, passed the twenty-fifth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, shall be allowed to the proprietors of the Magurawock and Schoodick Canal Company to complete said Canal agreeably to the conditions of their charter and without forfeiting the same, or losing any privileges or immunities granted to said Company by said Act.

Further time allowed to complete said Canal.

Chapter 413.

AN ACT authorizing the erection of a Bridge over New Meadows River.

Approved February 24, 1838.
