time of one year from and after the passing of this Act, shall be allowed to the Proprietors of the Caratunk Bridge, to erect and complete the Bridge which they were empowered to erect and complete, by an Act of the Legislature of this State, passed March the thirteenth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five, without forfeiting their charter, or losing any powers or privileges or immunities granted them by said Act.

Chapter 416.

AN ACT to incorporate the Maine Patent Spiral Vent Water Wheel Company.

Approved February 24, 1838.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That* Thomas H. Brewer, Otis L. Bridges, Joshua Veasey, Manly B. Townsend, Luther C. White, and Alexander H. Weymouth, and their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the Maine Patent Spiral Vent Water Wheel Company.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted, That* the private property of all the persons named in this Act of incorporation, and their associates and successors, shall be held for the damage any person may or shall have sustained by them, and to make good all their warranties.

Chapter 417.

AN ACT to incorporate the Pittston Steam Mill Company.

Approved February 24, 1838.

Corporators.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That* John Jewett, Gideon Barker, Alphonso Clark, Wil-

ham Stevens 2d and John O. P. Stevens, their associates, successors and assigns be, and they are hereby incorporated into a body politic, by the name of the Corporation name. Pittston Steam Mill Company, for the purpose of grinding wheat, corn, and all or any other kinds of grain and of sawing lumber of any and all descriptions—and such corporation may erect such mills, works, machines and buildings on their own land, as may be necessary for carrying on, any, or all of the above named branches of manufacture and trade; said mill and buildings to be erected in such place or places, Location. within the town of Pittston, in the County of Kennebec as to the Company may seem fit.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That said Corporation may hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding at any one time Fifteen Thousand Dollars, with power to bargain, sell and dispose of the same. Capital Stock, \$15,000.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That any two of the persons above named may call the first meeting of said Corporation at such time and place, as they may see fit, by giving notice of the same for two weeks successively in some newspaper published in the County of Kennebec, for the purpose of making such by-laws and regulations for the government of said corporation as they may deem necessary. Chapter 418.

AN ACT to set off certain lots of land in the town of Hartford, with the inhabitants thereon, and annex the same to the town of Canton.
