Chapter 420.

AN ACT to incorporate the Wilton Upper Mills Manufacturing Company.

Approved February 23, 1838.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That Charles Morse, Joseph Additon, A. S. C. Strickland, George Gage, S. Strickland, James L. Brooks, their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the Wilton Upper Mills Manufacturing Company, for the purpose of manufacturing wool, wood, cotton, iron and steel at Wilton Upper Mills, in Wilton, and said corporation may erect such mills, dams, works, machines and buildings, and dig such canals on their own lands as may be necessary for carrying on these useful manufactures and branches of trade—to have and to hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding fifty thousand dollars in value, and to have the powers to give, grant, sell and dispose of the same; and shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and requirements, expressed in the several Acts of this State defining the general powers and duties incident to manufacturing companies.
