SECT. 4. *Be it further enacted*, That if said corporation shall neglect or refuse for the space of three years from and after the passing of this Act, to build and complete said Bridge, then this Act to be void. To be completed within 3 years.

SECT. 5. *Be it further enacted*, That the first meeting of this corporation may be called, in any manner by which a majority of the persons named in the first section of this Act may determine, by giving at least seven days notice of the time and place, by written notices in at least two public places in Anson, and one in Madison. First meeting.

Chapter 431.

AN ACT accepting the surrender of the charter of the Penobscot Bank.

Approved March 6, 1838.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled*, That the surrender of the charter of the Penobscot Bank be, and the same hereby is accepted, and the same shall terminate when this Act shall take effect. Surrender accepted.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That the said bank shall continue in its corporate capacity for and during the term of two years from the time this Act shall take effect, for the sole purpose of collecting the debts due the corporation, selling and conveying the property and estate thereof, and shall remain liable for the payment of all debts due from the same, and shall be capable of prosecuting and defending suits at law, and for choosing directors for the purposes aforesaid, and for closing its concerns. To continue a corporation two years for certain purposes.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect and be in force from and after five days from the time of its approval by the Governor.
