From Paris to of Oxford, with the inhabitants thereof, be and the  
 Oxford. same hereby is annexed to the town of Oxford, *Provided*, that the owners of said half lot, and the inhabitants resident thereon shall be holden to pay to the town of Paris all taxes which have been legally assessed upon them by the authority of said town of Paris prior to the passing of this Act.

### Chapter 440.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Seaville.

Approved March 8, 1838.

Territory.

Name.

First meeting.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled*, That all that part of the town of Mount Desert in the County of Hancock, including certain Islands hereafter described, bounded as follows, to wit: on the North by the northern end of Bartlett's Island, on the East by the western coast of Mount Desert Island, on the South by the southern end of Ship Island, and on the West by Blue Hill Bay, including Bartlett's Island, Hardwood Island, Robinson's Island, and the small contiguous Islands within said bounds, with the inhabitants thereon, be and the same is hereby incorporated into a town by the name of Seaville, and the inhabitants of said town are hereby vested with all the powers, privileges and immunities which the inhabitants of other towns within this State do, or may by law enjoy.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That any Justice of the Peace, within said County, is hereby empowered to issue his warrant to some inhabitant of said town directing him to notify the inhabitants thereof to meet at such time and place as he shall appoint, to choose such officers as other towns are empowered to choose at their annual town meetings.
