## Chapter 441,

AN ACT to incorporate the proprietors of the Lowder Cemetery.

Approved March 8, 1838.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That Samuel Lowder of Bangor, his associates, successors Corporators and and assigns, be and hereby are constituted a corpora- corporate name. tion by the name of the "Lowder Cemetery," with all the powers and subject to all the liabilities mentioned in "An Act concerning Corporations"—with the power to have and hold not exceeding one acre of land in May hold an acre of land, &c. the city of Bangor, which shall be used solely and exclusively for the purposes of a Cemetery for the dead, and personal property to the amount of five hundred dollars—it being the same land now owned by said Lowder, and which he has inclosed with a brick wall and is on the South side of the northwest Avenue.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That said Corporation may divide the land held as aforesaid into six- Division, or allotments. ty-five allotments, together with suitable and convenient pathways and alleys, and assign in writing one allotment or more to each corporator to be held by them respectively, and by their heirs and assigns, subject to —subject to such rules as corporation shall ordain. such rules and regulations as the corporation shall from time to time, ordain and establish for the sole purpose aforesaid; *Provided however,* if any member of the corporation shall use or allow any other member of the corporation to use the allotment or allotments assigned to him as aforesaid, for any other purpose than as aforesaid, the same shall forthwith revert to and become the property of this corporation, and subject to be again allotted as above prescribed.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That no part of said land, either before or after such allotment, shall be liable to be taken on execution or warrant of dis- —exempt from attachment. tress, and no highway shall be laid out on or over said

land, and the same shall not be subject to taxation, so long as the same shall be used and dedicated exclusively to the purposes aforesaid.

### Chapter 442.

AN ACT to provide in part for the Expenditures of Government.

Approved March 10, 1838.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That in order to provide for the operation of certain Acts and Resolves of the Legislature requiring the payment of money from the Treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of the Government for the current year, the following sums be and the same are hereby appropriated, to be paid out of any moneys in the Treasury, the same to be in lieu of all other existing appropriations whatsoever. And the Governor with advice of the Council, is hereby authorized at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw his warrants upon the Treasurer for the same.
