Chapter 443.

AN ACT authorizing A. B. Perry to call the first meeting of the Franklin Bridge Corporation.

Approved March 10, 1838.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That A. B. Perry be and he is hereby authorized to call the first meeting of the Franklin Bridge Corporation, in the same manner as Edward Rouse was authorized to call said meeting in the Sixth Section of the Act authorizing the erection of said Bridge.

Chapter 444.

AN ACT to provide in part for the expenditures of Government.

Approved March 12, 1838.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That in order to provide for the operation of certain Acts and Resolves of the Legislature, requiring the payment of

money from the Treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of the Government for the current year, the following sums be, and the same hereby are appropriated to be paid out of any moneys in the Treasury. And the Governor with the advice of Council is hereby authorized at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw his warrants on the Treasury of the State for the same. *Provided however*, should there not be funds sufficient in the Treasury for the payment of the appropriations under this Act, when the same shall become due and payable, the Treasurer of the State is hereby authorized to issue negotiable State certificates payable in one year from the time of said appropriations becoming due, and bearing an interest of six per cent. per annum, which the several corporations or individuals may receive in payment, as aforesaid; or the same may remain on interest, to be paid by the Treasurer whenever he shall be in funds for that purpose, at their election, viz:—

Treasurer may issue notes, payable in one year, on interest.
