#### Chapter 462.

AN ACT to annex a part of Plantation No. 2, to the town of Sumner.

Approved March 20, 1839.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That the southeast corner lot of land in plantation No. 2, adjoining the s. E. corner lot town of Sumner be and the same hereby is set off from said Plantation and annexed to the town of Sumner; annexed and the inhabitants thereof shall there exercise and enjoy all the rights and privileges and be subject to all the duties and requisitions of the other inhabitants of said town of Sumner.

#### Chapter 463.

AN ACT to incorporate the Somerset Central Agricultural Society.

Approved March 21, 1839.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That Eleazer Coburn, John S. Tenney, Abner Coburn, Corporators, Benjamin McDaniel, James S. Tobie, Hannibal Ingalls, Johnson Frost and Milford P. Norton, their associates, and successors be and hereby are created a corporation by the name of the Somerset Central Ag- corporate name, ricultural Society, with power by that name to sue and be sued, use a common seal, make by-laws for the management of their concerns not repugnant to the laws of this State, purchase and hold estate, real or Income of capi-personal, the yearly income of which shall not exceed exceed \$3,000. three thousand dollars, to be used exclusively in pro- how used. moting agriculture and the mechanic arts connected therewith.
