long to any proprietors shall not have been demanded at the expiration of one year from and after he or they shall have been notified of the sale of said house, each and every such share or shares shall be forfeited to the town.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That a majority of said proprietors resident in said town, be authorized at a notified meeting to choose some person or persons to act as agent in the sale of said house and the distribution of the proceeds thereof.

Chapter 483.

AN ACT to incorporate the Franklin Granite Company.

Approved March 22, 1838.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That Increase S. Withington, Laban Lincoln, Hiram Morrison, Alfred W. Whitbridge, Franklin A. Day, their associates, successors and assigns, be and they hereby are created a corporation by the name of the Franklin Granite Company for the purpose of quarrying, manufacturing and working granite on their own land in the towns of Hallowell and Augusta in the County of Kennebec, and for the purpose of vending, transporting and dealing in the same and also for engaging in such other branches of business as may be necessarily conneted therewith, and for these purposes shall have all powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and requirements expressed in the several Acts in this State, defining the general powers and duties of manufacturing corporations.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That said company may take, hold and manage any real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars.

Chapter 484.

AN ACT to incorporate the Kennebec Granite Company.

Approved March 22, 1838.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House
 of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That*
 Corporators. William L. Harmon, Isaac C. Irish, Eliphalet Clark,
 Ira Crocker, their associates, successors and assigns,
 be, and they hereby are created a corporation by the
 Corporate name. name of "Kennebec Granite Company" for the pur-
 pose of quarrying, manufacturing and working granite
 on their own land in the town of Hallowell in the
 County of Kennebec, and for the purpose of vending,
 transporting and dealing in the same, and also of en-
 gaging in such other branches of business as may be
 necessarily connected therewith, and for these purpo-

Chapter 485.

AN ACT accepting the surrender of the charter of the Damariscotta Bank.

Approved March 22, 1838.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House*
