## Chapter 500.

AN ACT to incorporate the Wilton Manufacturing Company.

Approved March 23, 1838.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That

Corporators. John Barker, Luther Chaney, Jesse Huse, Henry Butterfield, Henry Butterfield Jr., their associates, successors and assigns, be and they are hereby made a

Corporate name. body politic and corporate by the name of the Wilton Manufacturing Company for the purpose of manufacturing cotton, linen and wool in the town of Wilton in Kennebec County, and for the purpose of vending, transporting and dealing in the same, and also of engaging in such other branches of business as may be necessarily connected therewith and for these purposes shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and requirements expressed in the several Acts in this State defining the general powers and duties of manufacturing corporations.

Powers, &c.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That said company may take, hold and manage any real or personal estate to an amount not exceeding fifty thousand dollars.

Capital \$50,000. Stock,

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That Luther Chaney may call the first meeting of said corporation at such time and place and in such manner as he may think proper.
