CHAPTER 19.

Resolve in favor of George Sawtell.

See 1 12 Marie 1 1 Approved February 24, 1838.

RESOLVED, That in consideration of a severe injury received by George Sawtell while performing military duty, there, be paid to him annually, out of the Treasury of the State, a pension of Three Dollars per month, for two years, commencing on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty-seven.

CHAPTER 20.

Resolve in favor of James Pomroy.

Approved February 24, 1838.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to James Pomroy of Hampden, on account of an injury sustained by him while in the military service of the State, Five Dollars per month, in lieu of all pensions now paid him by the State.

CHAPTER 21.

Resolves respecting the Franking Privilege.

Approved February 24, 1838.

RESOLVED, That the Franking Privilege should be extended to the Governors and Secretaries of the several States.

RESOLVED, That the same privilege should be extended to the members of the several State Legislatures so far as to transmit within the limits of their respective States, documents printed by order of the Legislatures thereof.

RESOLVED, That his Excellency the Governor be requested to transmit a copy of these Resolves to the Governors of the several States and to each of our Senators and Representatives

in Congress.
