CHAPTER 22.

Resolve authorizing a temporary Loan in behalf of the State.

Approved, February 27, 1838.

RESOLVED, That the Treasurer be, and he hereby is authorized to procure on the faith of the State, a Loan of Thirty-eight thousand six hundred and seventy-five dollars from the several Banks, and in proportion hereinafter named, at a rate of interest not exceeding five per centum per annum, reimbursable by five annual instalments, or at any shorter period, at the pleasure of the Government.

RESOLVED, That the Treasurer is hereby authorized to call on the following named Banks for the several sums following, agreeably to the provisions of a law entitled "An Act to regulate Banks and Banking," passed March thirty-first, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-one, to wit:

RESOLVED, That the Treasurer be and he hereby is directed, whenever he shall judge that the state of the public funds will allow of it, without prejudice to other necessary purposes, to pay any of the Requisition Loans, made by authority of these Resolves. And in all repayments made to Banks, the Treasurer shall preserve the *pro rata* principle, as nearly as may be, without regarding sums inconveniently small.

RESOLVED, That the Treasurer be and he hereby is authorized to procure on the faith of the State a Loan of Two Hundred and Six Thousand Four Hundred Dollars at a rate of interest not exceeding five per cent, payable annually, said Loan to be reimbursable by four equal annual instalments, at and after six years; for the purpose of paying the several Banks the amount due to them respectively from the State, and said Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to issue State securities or certificates therefor. And any Bank deciding within three months from the passage of this Resolve, to receive in payment for the amount due them from the State, the certificates or securities as aforesaid shall have the right so to do; and said certificates so taken in payment shall be considered as part of the Loan they are required to make to the State under the Act regulating Banks and Banking, passed March thirty-first, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-one.
