Treasury of the State, out of any monies not otherwise appropriated, to Charles Gowen, the sum of One Hundred and Eighty Dollars, in full payment for expenses incurred by him in reclaiming certain fugitives from justice.

CHAPTER 24.

Resolve in favor of Huldah Cook.

Approved, February 28, 1838.

RESOLVED, That a warrant drawn by the Governor upon the Treasurer of State, payable to Valentine Cook, deceased, under the Resolve of the Legislature of Maine, approved February 18th, 1826, for Thirty-six Dollars, be paid to Huldah Cook his widow, and the Treasurer of State is hereby authorized to pay the same to the said Huldah Cook.

CHAPTER 25.

Resolve in favor of William Patten.

Approved, February 28, 1838.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this State to William Patten of Kennebunkport, the sum of Five Dollars, it being the same sum paid by him on the sixteenth of March, A. D. 1837, for duty on a Justice commission, issued to William Huff, Jr. and which commission said Huff has never received.

CHAPTER 26.

Resolve in favor of Elisha Bodwell.

Approved, February 28, 1838.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this State, the sum of Twenty Dollars, to Elisha
