EIGHT HUNDRED AND THIRTY-EIGHT.

CHAPTER 40.

Resolve in favor of Gilman Turner and William M. Saunders.

Approved March 15, 1838.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid to Gilman Turner and William M. Saunders the sum of one dollar per night for every night they shall have been employed watching the Public Buildings since the first day of January last past and that the Governor with the advice of Council be authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

CHAPTER 41.

Resolve in favor of Seth W. Stewart.

Approved March 15, 1838.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this State, to Seth W. Stewart of Township No. One, Fifth Range, the sum of Ninety-two Dollars and twenty-four cents, in full remuneration for expenses incurred in taking care of a foreigner sick with the small pox.

CHAPTER 42.

Resolve in favor of the town of Liberty.

Approved March 15, 1838.

RESOLVED, That the County Commissioners of the County of Waldo be and they are hereby authorized to expend a sum not exceeding Five Hundred Dollars out of the Treasury of said County to aid the town of Liberty in making a county road which was ordered to be opened by the County Commissioners of said County through said town on the third day of October last. And the sum aforesaid shall be expended on said road under the superintendance of said Commissioners or by their agent appointed for that purpose within twelve months from the passage of this Resolve.
