CHAPTER 55.

Resolve in favor of Charles Jones, Ariel Kelley, William Chapman, Thomas Morrell, Jr. Daniel Smith, and Mark Stevenson.

Approved March 20, 1838.

RESOLVED, That the Treasurer of State be and he hereby is authorized and directed to pay Charles Jones the sum of Thirteen Dollars, and to Ariel Kelly, Wm. Chapman, Thomas Morrell, Jr. Mark Stevenson and Daniel Smith, the sum of Nine Dollars and Twenty-four Cents each, all of Newburg in the County of Penobscot—it being in full for their travel and attendance as witnesses in the case of election of Nathaniel Hanscom contested by Fred. A. Butman.

CHAPTER 56.

Resolve for the publication and distribution of the Returns of Common Schools for the year 1837.

Approved March 20, 1838.

RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be required to make an Abstract in Tabular form, by Counties, of the returns of Common Schools made by the several towns, Cities and Plantations, for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, together with a statement of the population of each Town, City and Plantation according to the census taken in that year, and such comparisons of the Returns of Schools and of population, and such deductions therefrom as may be usefully and conveniently made, and a statement of the amount paid or to be paid to each Town, City and Plantation out of the Bank Tax or School Fund for the same year.

RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be authorized to cause ten thousand copies of the Abstract and statements aforesaid to be printed and distributed for the information of the people, reserving five hundred copies thereof to be laid before

the next Legislature for the use of the members.
