EIGHTEENTH LEGISLATURE

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE,

PASSED AT THE SESSION

WHICH COMMENCED ON THE THIRD DAY OF JANUARY, AND ENDED ON
THE TWENTY-THIRD DAY OF MARCH, ONE THOUSAND
EIGHT HUNDRED AND THIRTY-EIGHT.

New Brunswick, which are now, or may hereafter be, ports for the delivery and reception of cargoes for British vessels, be made ports of entry for the delivery and reception of cargoes for American vessels, or that the ports of the United States should be closed against British vessels coming from said Provinces.

RESOLVED, That our Senators and Representatives in Congress be requested to exert their influence in obtaining the object contemplated by the foregoing Resolve.

RESOLVED, That the Governor be requested to transmit copies of the above resolutions to the President, and to each of our Senators and Representatives in Congress.

CHAPTER 65.

Resolve in favor of Cherryfield Academy.

Approved, March 22, 1838.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this State for the use and benefit of the Cherryfield Academy the sum of Two Hundred Dollars per year for the term of two years from and after the tenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine—*Provided*, That the Trustees of said Academy cause to be erected on lands belonging to said Institution, a good, sufficient and well finished building for the use of the same; and produce to the Governor and Council, satisfactory evidence that said building is completed and fitted for use, on or before the aforesaid tenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine. Then the Governor with advice of Council is authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the amount aforesaid.

CHAPTER 66.

Resolves making appropriations for Military purposes.

Approved, March 22, 1838.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and granted, for the purposes hereinafter named, the following sums, to wit: Nine Hun-
