and the Governor is hereby authorized and empowered to draw his warrant on the Treasurer of State for the aforesaid sum, Provided he be satisfied, by Bond or otherwise, that said sum with such aid as individuals may give, shall build in a good workmanlike manner, a good and substantial wooden Bridge across said river, not more than ten rods from the old Bridge, with sluiceways of sufficient width and height to admit lumber through at all seasons of the year.

CHAPTER 75.

Resolve in favor of Thomas Sawyer, Jr.

Approved, March 23, 1838.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State, to Thomas Sawyer, Junior, Thirteen Dollars and Fifty Cents, the same being for his time and expenses while attending before the Governor and Council in eighteen hundred and thirty-six, to settle the accounts against the State for surveying Township Letter D.
