CHAPTER 78.

An Additional Resolve for the payment of Accounts against the State.

Approved, March 23, 1838.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid from the Treasury of the State, out of moneys not otherwise appropriated; to the several persons, cities, towns and plantations mentioned in the additional Roll of Accounts, No. 19, the sums set against the names of such persons, cities, towns and plantations respectively, amounting in the whole to the sum of Six Thousand Three Hundred Seventy Dollars and Fifty Four Cents in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they refer.

CHAPTER 79.

Additional Resolve providing for the printing and distribution of Blank returns of Votes.

Approved, March 23, 1838.

RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State cause to be printed and transmitted to the Clerks of the several Cities, Towns and Plantations in this State as soon as may be, Blank returns of Votes for Governor, Senators, Representatives in the State Legislature and Representatives in the Congress of the United States, agreeable to the forms in a Resolve approved February eighth, eighteen hundred and thirty-four—also Blanks to the several Counties in this State, for the return of votes for County Treasurer and Register of Deeds, yearly until otherwise ordered.
