**CHAPTER 99.**

Resolve in favor of Town of Belmont.

Approved, March 23, 1838.

**RESOLVED**, That the State Treasurer be, and he hereby is authorized and directed to pay to the Treasurer of the town of Belmont in the County of Waldo the sum of Three Dollars and Fifty Cents, it being for a like sum paid by said town to seven soldiers on the day of review and which the town has never been repaid.

**CHAPTER 100.**

Resolve in favor of Jacob Doughty.

Approved March 23, 1838.

**RESOLVED**, That the Governor and Council be and hereby are authorized to place Jacob Doughty on the list of the beneficiaries under the Resolve in relation to the indigent blind providing for placing them at the New England Asylum for the Blind at Boston, notwithstanding he may be over the age of forty years.
