may be sufficiently near to connect conveniently with the opposite ferry-landing; and all the provisions and liabilities provided in the additional act aforesaid, shall apply to the passage way made at such public landing as if made to the ferry landing.

SEC. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That the County Commissioners may, when they judge it expedient, contract with some person or persons to perform the duties devolving on the Ferryman by this act and the additional acts aforesaid, by giving notice thereof to the Ferryman before the closing of the river, and such notice shall exonerate said Ferryman from all the liabilities respecting such passage way on the ice during the ensuing winter, or for such longer period as the contract may be made for, and all the duties and liabilities from which said Ferryman is thus exonerated, shall attach to the person with whom the County Commissioners may have contracted.

County Commissioners may contract with some person to perform certain duties of ferryman in such cases, by giving notice, &c.

Ferryman therefrom exonerated, &c.

### Chapter 411.

AN ACT for assessing and taxing Turnpikes in the towns through which they pass.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled*, That all Turnpikes in this State, shall be assessed and taxed in the towns wherein the same may lie, in the same manner as real estate.

Turnpikes to be taxed like real estate.
