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FAYETTE BUKER.—NATHANIEL SPRINGER.

Chapter 505.

AN ACT to set off Favette Buker and lands from Penobscot and annex the same to Castine.

Approved February 12, 1839.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Fayette Buker, with Annexation from his poll and estate, including all that part of his farm whereon he now lives and lying in the town of Penobscot, be and the same is hereby set off from the town of Penobscot and annexed to the town of Castine :-- Provided, that said Buker shall be held to pay all taxes now legally assessed upon him and his estate in said Penobscot, previous to the passing of this act.

Chapter 506.

AN ACT to set off so much of the farm of Nathaniel Springer as lies in the town of Freeport, and annex the same to the town of Brunswick.

Approved February 15, 1839.

Be it enacted by the Scnate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That so much of Nathaniel Springer's farm as lies within the town of Freeport, which piece of land is bounded as follows, viz :---beginning on the line between the towns of Freeport and Brunswick at the southeasterly part of said farm, thence running southwesterly about seventeen rods to the south corner of said farm,-thence northwesterly on the line of said farm to the west corner of the same, thence northeasterly about seventeen rods to the line dividing said towns, thence southeasterly by said town line to the first bounds;-be and the same hereby is set off from the town of Freeport and annexed to the town of Brunswick.

Annexation from Freeport to Brunswick.
