**Chapter 513.**

AN ACT in addition to an Act to incorporate the Calais and Baring Railway Company.

Approved February 25, 1839.

SEC. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That said Corporation may hereafter take the name of the Calais and Baring Rail Road Company, instead of the name by which it is now known.

Corporate name changed.

SEC. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That said Corporation shall be allowed the term of three years, in addition to the times mentioned in the the third section of the act to which this is additional, to complete the works contemplated by said act, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

Additional time of three years to complete their works.

**Chapter 514.**

AN ACT to incorporate the Merchants Insurance Company.

Approved February 25, 1839.

SEC. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That Willis Patten, James Crosby, George W. Pickering, Theodore B. McIntire, Charles Cooper, Hayward Pierce, Waldo T. Pierce, Abner Taylor, Thomas Jenness and Leonard March, with their associates successors and assigns be, and they hereby are, created a Corporation by the name of the Merchants Insurance Company, with the powers usually granted to other Insurance Companies, and subject to all the duties, obligations and restrictions contained in a law of this State entitled "an Act to define the powers duties and restrictions of Insurance Companies," passed the twenty fourth day of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty one, for the term of twenty years from the passing of this Act, and by that name may sue
