Be it further enacted, That as soon as either SEC. 4. of the aforesaid dams shall be erected the said company shall be allowed to collect toll on all the logs, masts, spars, or other timber that shall pass the same at the rates aforesaid.

Be it further enacted, That this corporation Corporation SEC. 5. may continue twenty years from the passage of this act, years, and may hold property of real and personal estate not Capital \$20,000. exceeding twenty thousand dollars.

SEC. 6. Be it further enacted, That section fifth of an act passed the nineteenth day of February eighteen hundred and thirty four is hereby repealed and also that Section of former part of section two passed February twenty ninth eighteen hundred and thirty six, which prescribed the rates of toll to be allowed for masts, logs, spars and other timber passing the dam at the outlet of the lower Twin Lake is hereby repealed.

### Chapter 538.

AN ACT to set off Daniel Fogg from Standish to Gorham.

Approved March 14, 1839.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Daniel Fogg with the land on which he now lives, consisting of twenty acres,

### Chapter 539.

AN ACT authorizing the sale of the old Meeting House (so called,) in New Sharon in the County of Franklin.

### Approved March 14, 1839.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Sec. 1. Representatives in Legislature assembled, That Stephen Howes, Ephraim Mayhew, Henry Mayhew, Benjamin Mayhew, John Trask, Willis Berry, Samuel H. Berry, Josiah Howes, Joshua Sawyer, William Boyington, Thomas Lancaster, James Howes Jr., Benjamin Smith, Joshua M. Hopkins, Fobes Ford, Ezekiel Lancaster, Leonard W. Russel, Joseph Gennings, Jonathan Russ and Ebenezer Weeks, proprietors of the old Meeting House (so called) in New Sharon, or a committee by them to be chosen, hereby are authorized and empowered to sell said Meeting House at To give notice of public auction, first giving notice of the the time and place of sale, by posting up notices thereof in two or more public places in New Sharon aforesaid three weeks previous to such sale.

> Be it further enacted, That the proceeds of SEC. 2. said sale, after deducting the necessary expenses, shall be paid to Stephen Howes, Fobes Ford, and Leonard W. Russel of New Sharon aforesaid, to be, by them divided among the proprietors of the pews, in proportion to the original cost of said pews.
