To have one half

And said town of Argyle shall retain one half of all the public or reserved lands, called the ministerial and school lands, leaving to the west part of said plantation an equal half of said reserved lands, being so located and divided at the time aforesaid.

To support all  
Paupers.

SEC. 3. *Be it further enacted*, That all persons now being or hereafter becoming chargeable as paupers, having gained their legal settlement in said town of Argyle, shall be supported by the same.

First meeting—  
how called.

SEC. 4. *Be it further enacted*, That any Justice of the Peace within said County, is hereby empowered to issue his warrant to some inhabitant of said town, directing him to notify the inhabitants thereof, to meet at such time and place, as he shall appoint to choose such officers as other towns are empowered to choose, at their annual town meetings.

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### Chapter 547.

AN ACT to change the name of Charles Cobb.

Approved March 19, 1839.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled*, That Charles Cobb of Durham be allowed to take the name of Charles Corydon Cobb.
