Chapter 13.

Resolve in favor of Hannah Fogg.

Approved January 28, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be paid to Hannah Fogg of Gorham, widow of Moses Fogg, Fifty Dollars, out of any money in the Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, in consideration of services performed by said Moses Fogg, in the War of the Revolution.

Chapter 14.

Resolve in favor of Samuel G. Bodfish.

Approved January 29, 1839.

RESOLVED, That the Land Agent be, and he hereby is authorized to make and execute a deed to Samuel G. Bodfish, of lots numbered two and three, in the third range of lots belonging to this State, in the town of Eliotsville, County of Piscataquis, as a remuneration to said Bodfish, for making a road from Eliotsville to Wilson Stream, thereby promoting the sale and settlement of the Public Lands.

Chapter 15.

Resolve in favor of Moses Saunders Junior.

Approved January 29, 1839.

RESOLVED, That the Land Agent be directed to give up to Moses Saunders Junr. the note or notes now held by the State against said Saunders for two lots of land lying in the town of Ellsworth, and to discharge the mortgage held by the State for the payment of said notes. Provided, said Saunders shall pay to the Land Agent the sum of Sixty Dollars within twelve months from the passage of this Resolve,
