the Commonwealth of Massachusetts shall authorize and empower her Land Agent to unite with the Land Agent of this State in continuing the same and in contributing her equal proportion with this State in making the same; and that the Land Agent of this State is hereby authorized to expend for this purpose, the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars, the ensuing year, from money paid into the Land Office.

RESOLVED, That the whole amount of the above appropriation shall be expended on that part of the road south of the point where it crosses the Aroostook River, provided so much shall be required to grub and turnpike said road, and bridge the streams that intersect it.

Chapter 18.

Resolve in favor of Sebattis Neptune.

Approved February 6, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this State to Sebattis Neptune, the sum of Fifty Dollars, to defray the expenses of his journey to the seat of government as a special agent chosen by the Passamaquoddy Tribe to call upon the Executive and Legislature upon business relating to said tribe—and the Governor with the advice of Council be, and hereby is authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

Chapter 19.

Resolve additional to the "Resolve relative to the annual distribution of the School Fund."

Approved February 6, 1839.

RESOLVED, That the Treasurer be, and he hereby is directed to apportion the School Fund among the cities, towns, plantations and unincorporated places of the State, assuming as the basis of such assignment the number of persons between the ages of four and twenty one years as returned in the census of eighteen hundred and thirty seven.
