D. Dudley, one hundred and thirteen dollars—Samuel Leadbetter, one hundred and twelve dollars—James Campbell Jr., one hundred thirteen dollars and sixty six cents—and William Bryant, seventy dollars—which several sums, are in full for their services, for ascertaining, running and locating the North Eastern Boundary line of the State, by virtue of a Resolve approved March 23d, 1833.

Chapter 35.

An additional Resolve relative to Trespassers upon the Public Lands.

Approved February 22, 1839.

RESOLVED, That the Governor be requested forthwith to communicate to the President of the United States, the measures recently adopted by the State of Maine in relation to the trespasses on the public lands of this State; and also copies of the correspondence between the Governor of New Brunswick and the Executive of Maine in relation to those measures; together with any information in his possession relative to the subject; and to request the aid of the general government in support of the rights of the State of Maine.

Chapter 36.

Resolve in favor of the State Road from the town of Wilson to Moose Head Lake.

Approved February 25, 1839.

RESOLVED, That the sum of Six Hundred Dollars, be and hereby is appropriated for the purpose of repairing the State Road from the dwelling house of H. G. O. Barrows, in the town of Wilson to Moose Head Lake; and the Governor, with advice of Council, is hereby authorized to appoint an agent to superintend the expenditure of said money.
