range west from the east line of the State to the Aroostook River; *Provided* the Commonwealth of Massachusetts appropriate a like sum to be expended on said Road. And the Land Agents of the State of Maine and Commonwealth of Massachusetts are hereby authorized to expend said money in the making of said road either by making contracts or otherwise. And if said road passes over any taxable lands the said Agents are authorized to expend on said lands only so much as in their opinion the public interest requires.

Chapter 72.

Resolve in favor of Solomon Clark.

Approved March 19, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to Solomon Clark of Hallowell, Four Dollars per month for one year on account of an injury received by him while engaged in the military service of the State.

Chapter 73.

Resolve in favor of Elizabeth Baker.

Approved March 19, 1839.

RESOLVED, That the benefit of a Resolve, passed March twenty-fourth in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty-six, entitled "a Resolve additional to a Resolve passed March seventeenth, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty-five entitled" "a Resolve in favor of certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and the widows of the deceased officers and soldiers," be and the same is hereby extended to Elizabeth Baker, the widow of Amos Baker, a Revolutionary Soldier, although said Amos Baker belonged to the New Hampshire line, and not to the Massachusetts line. *Provided*, that in other respects, the said Elizabeth Baker shall come within the provisions of said Resolves passed March twenty-fourth, in the year of our Lord, eighteen hundred and thirty-six.
