Chapter 83.

Resolve in favor of Eleanor Gray.

Approved March 21, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State, the sum of sixty dollars, to Eleanor Gray, of Sedgwick, in the county of Hancock, to relieve her from immediate pecuniary distress, on account of the death of her late husband, Sewall Gray, who died in consequence of a wound received while in the military service of the State.

Chapter 84.

Resolve establishing the pay of the Militia when in actual service.

Approved March 21, 1839.

RESOLVED, That the Militia of this State when in actual service, shall receive the same pay and allowances as are paid and allowed to the army of the United States with such addition to each ration as the Commander-in-Chief may direct, and the service require.

Chapter 85.

Resolve requiring the Secretary of State to publish a list of the Stockholders of the Banks in this State.

Approved March 21, 1839.

RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be and hereby is required annually to publish a list of the stockholders in each Bank in this State with the amount of stock owned by each stockholder agreeably to the returns made by law to the Legislature of this State and it shall be the duty of the Secretary of State to distribute to each town in this State and also to each bank in this State one copy of such
