to lease the ground in front of the State House, east of the Hallowell road, for a term not exceeding five years, to some suitable person or persons who will give a sufficient bond to the State to the acceptance of the Governor, conditioned that he or they will cause said grounds to be cultivated in a husbandlike manner by ploughing, planting and thoroughly manuring for at least the first three years of the term, and at the termination of the lease to surrender the premises to the State, well laid down to grass.

Chapter 88.

Resolve in favor of the Insane Hospital.

Approved March 21, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury, the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars to discharge present legal liabilities and to finish one wing of the Insane Hospital, with so much of the central building, as may be necessary for its convenient occupation, and the Governor, with advice of Council is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasury for the same.

Chapter 89.

Resolve in favor of Joseph Pomroy.

Approved March 22, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State, to Joseph Pomroy of Levant, the sum of Four Dollars per month for one year, it being in consequence of a wound received by him while in the service of the State.
