cities, towns and plantations in said State, from the time the accounts of said cities, towns and plantations are allowed, by the Legislature, until the same are paid, unless the Treasurer shall give notice in the State paper that he is ready to pay the same within thirty days from the passage of this Resolve.

Chapter 95.

Resolve in favor of James Perkins.

Approved March 22, 1839.

WHEREAS James Perkins, of the House of Representatives, while in the service of the State as a member of said House, at the present session, was at the early part of the session taken sick, and still continues so, and has, by reason of said sickness been subjected to considerable expense—Therefore,

RESOLVED, That there be paid to said Perkins, out of the Treasury of the State, the sum of Forty Dollars, to defray the expenses incurred in said sickness, and separate from his pay for time and attendance as a member of said House.

Chapter 96.

Resolve to authorize the Treasurer to issue certificates to cities, towns and plantations in certain cases.

Approved March 22, 1839.

RESOLVED, That the Treasurer of State be and he hereby is authorized and required to issue to the Treasurers of the several cities, towns and plantations in this State, certificates of the amount due from the State with interest thereon, to such cities, towns and plantations; said certificates to be signed by the Treasurer, or in his absence by James B. Cahoon, chief clerk in the Treasury Department.
