## Chapter 99.

Resolve for payment of the Bounty on Wheat and Corn.

*Approved March 23, 1839.*

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid from the Treasury of the State to the Treasurers of the several cities, towns and plantations mentioned in this Roll of Accounts the sums set against their names respectively, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of one hundred and fifty-three thousand nine hundred and eighty-one lars and seventy-four cents.

## Chapter 100.

Resolve in favor of Samuel Daggett, Treasurer of the town of New Vineyard.

*Approved March 23, 1839.*

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid to Samuel Daggett, Treasurer of the town of New Vineyard out of the Treasury of this State the sum of Sixty Dollars and Sixty-Seven Cents—for so much money paid to soldiers and for powder in eighteen hundred and thirty-eight; and that the Governor be authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.
