Chapter 101.

Resolve making an appropriation for the purpose of procuring books of instruction in military tactics.

Approved March 23, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State the sum of Two Thousand Dollars for the purpose of procuring books of instruction in military tactics, for the use of the officers of the Militia, to be paid when in the opinion of the Governor with the advice of Council, the public interest may require it, and for the expenditure of which the Adjutant General shall be accountable.

Chapter 102.

Resolve in favor of Williams Smart.

Approved March 23, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to Williams Smart, Assistant Secretary of the Senate, the sum of Twenty-Five Dollars to defray the expenses incurred by him in consequence of sickness and separate from his pay for his services as Assistant Secretary the present session of the Legislature.

Chapter 103.

Resolve in favor of Cotton Ward and Wm. Rust.

Approved March 23, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the State Treasury to Cotton Ward, Fifteen Dollars, and the same amount to Wm. Rust it being for travel and attendance as witness in contested election of Gideon Richards the last Legislature.
