NINETEENTH LEGISLATURE

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE,

PASSED AT ITS SESSION

WHICH COMMENCED ON THE SECOND DAY OF JANUARY, AND ENDED ON
THE TWENTY-FIFTH DAY OF MARCH, ONE THOUSAND
EIGHT HUNDRED AND THIRTY-NINE.

Chapter 121.

Resolve in favor of P. M. Garcelon, of Lisbon.

Approved March 25, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State to P. M. Garcelon, Six Dollars, it being for three days during the session of this Legislature he was confined by sickness at home and not made up in the Pay Roll of the House. And that the Governor be directed to draw his order on the Treasurer for the same.

Chapter 122.

Resolve in favor of the non-commissioned officers and soldiers of the Militia of Maine.

Approved March 25, 1839.

RESOLVED, That all non-commissioned officers and soldiers who have recently been called into service, for the protection of our property and jurisdiction upon our North Eastern Frontier shall be entitled to receive two dollars and fifty cents per month in addition to the pay now allowed to non-commissioned officers and soldiers in the army of the United States.

Chapter 123.

Resolve authorizing a requisition upon the several Banks in this State.

Approved March 25, 1839.

RESOLVED, That the Treasurer of this State, be authorized to make a requisition on the several Banks of this State to the amount authorized by law—*Provided however*, that he shall not require of any Bank more than five per cent. of its capital stock at any one time, *and provided also* that if any Bank has loaned or shall loan to the State within thirty days from the passage of this Resolve,

under the provisions of the Resolve of the fifteenth day of February A. D. 1839, a sum equivalent to said requisition such loan shall be in satisfaction of said requisition upon such Bank, and provided any bank which has loaned money to the State under former requisitions may be at liberty to take the same according to the provisions of the said Resolve of the fifteenth of February 1839.

Chapter 124.

Resolve in relation to the State Loans.

Approved March 25, 1839.

RESOLVED, That the Governor, with advice of Council, be and he hereby is, authorized to give to the Treasurer of State power to procure the permanent loans heretofore authorized, at a rate of interest exceeding six per cent., in case the said loans cannot be obtained at a rate of interest as heretofore provided; and in case the said loans cannot be obtained in any other way, that the Treasurer be authorized to sell the the same at public auction.

Chapter 125.

Resolve in favor of the towns of Liberty and Freedom.

Approved March 25, 1839.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this State to the town of Liberty the sum of Forty Three Dollars, and to the town of Freedom, Forty Two Dollars and Seventy Seven cents for cash paid to the Militia in said towns and for cartridges furnished for the same for one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight.
