Chapter 12.

AN ACT to change the name of the town of East Machias.

Name changed to
Mechisses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That the town of East Machias in the County of Washington shall be known hereafter by the name of Mechisses, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

Chapter 13.

AN ACT to provide in part for the expenditures of Government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That in order to provide for the operation of certain Acts and Resolves of the Legislature requiring the payment of money from the Treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of the Government for the current year, the following sums, be, and the same are hereby appropriated, to be paid out of any moneys in the Treasury, the same to be in lieu of all other existing appropriations whatever. And the Governor with advice of the Council, is hereby authorized at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw his warrants upon the Treasurer for the same.

Chapter 14.

AN ACT to extend the time to locate and construct the Portland, Saco and Portsmouth Rail Road.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That there shall be allowed four years to do and perform each of the several acts and things required to be done by the twelfth section of the Act entitled "an Act to establish the Portland, Saco and Portsmouth Rail Road Company," in addition to the several times therein allowed to do and perform the same.

Four years in addition to present time allowed.
