Chapter 19.

AN ACT to authorize the first Universalist Society in Freeport to appraise their meeting house, and to sell, take down, remove, or repair the same.

Names of appraisers.

SEC. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That Solomon Dennison, Edward Cushing, Joel Kelsey, Gideon Dennison, Joseph Dennison and Seth Bailey jun'r members of the first Universalist Society in Freeport and proprietors of the Universalist meeting house in said town, be and the same hereby are, authorized to have their meeting house appraised, and it shall be the duty of said society at any legal meeting thereof, called for that purpose, to appoint three judicious, disinterested men, whose duty it shall be to examine said meeting house, and faithfully appraise and determine the just value thereof.

Appraisers to make division according to the number of shares.

SEC. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That it shall be the duty of said appraisers, to make a fair and equal division of the sum so appraised according to the number of shares owned by each and all of the proprietors of said house. And the above named proprietors are hereby directed and required by the provisions of this Act to pay out to each legal claimant his or her proportion of said property.

Powers, &c.

SEC. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That the proprietors of the above named meeting house are hereby authorized to sell, take down, remove, or repair, said meeting house as they may lawfully determine at a legal meeting called for that purpose.
