Five Directors shall constitute a quorum.

their stead; and that five of said Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. And all Acts and parts of Acts, inconsistent with this Act, be and the same hereby are repealed. And this Act shall be in force and take effect from and after five days after its approval by the Governor.

Chapter 35.

AN ACT to exempt the proprietors of Turner Centre Bridge from lighting said bridge except at certain seasons.

Exempt from lighting bridge except 3 months in the year.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That the proprietors of the Turner Centre Bridge be and hereby are exempt from lighting their bridge as provided by a law approved March twelfth in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine except three months in each year commencing on the fifteenth day of September annually.

Chapter 36.

AN ACT respecting the Fire Department in the city of Portland.

All members belonging to any branch of the Fire Department, exempt from military duty.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That the officers and members of the Fire Department of the city of Portland whether known as Engine men, Hook and Ladder men, Hose men, or Chairmen, or by any other appropriate name, be, and
