—that Michael Robert Fannon, of New Gloucester, be allowed to take the name of Henry Angelo Fannon;—that Nelson Videto, of New Sharon, be allowed to take the name of John Nelson;—that Mary Jane Carpenter, of Cornville, be allowed to take the name of Mary Jane Newbegin;—that John Blue, Betsey Blue, wife of said John and John H. Blue, their son, and Agnes P. wife of the said John H., all of Bloomfield and Monmonth, be allowed to take the name of Ballou, as their surname;—that Jonathan Fly Wormwood, his wife and seven minor children, of Surry, be allowed to take the name of Wood, as their surname.

Chapter 47.

AN ACT to extend the limits of the charter of the Salt Water Falls Company, approved March twenty-fourth, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That the Salt Water Falls Company are hereby authorized to build, maintain, repair, and rebuild a dam and bridge across the Narraguagus river, at a place called the Narrows; instead of the "Salt Water Falls," as is granted in the third section of the Act to which this is an addition, any thing in said Act, to the contrary notwithstanding.
