**Chapter 62.**

AN ACT to extend the time of building the Bridge over the Saint Croix River at or near Sprague's Falls.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That three years from and after the passage of this Act, be, and hereby are granted to the proprietors of the Saint Croix Bridge Corporation to build and complete said Bridge, agreeable to the Act creating said corporation, approved March twenty-second in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven.

Three years in addition to the former time allowed to complete said bridge.

[Approved March 16, 1840.]

**Chapter 63.**

AN ACT to increase the salary of Register of Probate in the County of Franklin.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That the salary of Register of Probate in and for the County of Franklin be, and hereby is established at the sum of one hundred and seventy-five dollars per annum instead of one hundred and fifty dollars as is now provided by law.

Salary \$175.

**Chapter 64.**

AN ACT to divide the town of Orono and incorporate the north part into a town by the name of Old Town.

**SEC. 1.** *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That so much of the town of Orono in the
