District Court to
be held second
Tuesday of Sept.

District shall be held annually on the second Tuesday of September in the County of Piscataquis instead of the third Tuesday of September as is now provided by law, and all actions, suits, matters, and things, pending in said Court; and all writs, executions, warrants, recognizances, or other processes, which before the passing of this Act, would have been returnable to, or had day in said Court to be held on the third Tuesday of September shall after this Act takes effect, be returnable to, and have day in said Court to be held on the second Tuesday of September.

Provision of former act repealed.

SEC. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act be and the same are hereby repealed.

Chapter 82.

AN ACT authorizing school district No. 3 in Thomaston to sell their School house and land.

Agent authorized to dispose of house and lot, &c. agreeably to a vote of the district.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That the third School district in Thomaston be authorized to sell and convey their school house in said town together with the lot of land on which the same stands by their Agent to make execute and deliver a good and sufficient deed thereof to the purchaser or purchasers, provided said district at a legal meeting of the inhabitants thereof shall vote in favor of such sale, and the proceeds of such sale, shall be disposed of according to vote of said district.
