Chapter 83.

AN ACT additional to the several Acts now in force to organize, govern and discipline the Militia of this State.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That the Mayor and Aldermen of each city, the Selectmen of each town, and the Assessors of each plantation, who have not defined the limits of companies in the respective cities, towns and plantations as required by an Act entitled "an Act additional to an Act to organize, govern and discipline the Militia of this State" approved March fifth in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, shall ascertain and define the same on or before the first day of September next.

Aldermen, Selectmen and Assessors to define limits of companies before the first of September next.

[Approved March 18, 1840.]

Chapter 84.

AN ACT relative to lands forfeited to the State.

SEC. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled,* That where lands have been sold by this State and conveyed by conditional deed and the title to the same has become forfeited to the State in consequence of the non-payment of the money or non-performance of the conditions according to such deed, the right is hereby given to all such purchasers, or to persons claiming under them to revive and secure the title to such lands by the payment of the interest already due on the notes given for such lands on or before the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty, and paying whatever may remain due on said notes, one fourth in six, one fourth in twelve, one fourth in eighteen, and the remaining fourth in twenty-four months

Titles of land forfeited to the State, secured by payment of principal and interest due on notes given for such land.
