Chapter 1.

Resolve in favor of Richmond Loring.

Whereas the sum of six hundred dollars was appropriated by a Resolve of the Legislature, Feb. 25, 1839, for the purpose of repairing the State road from Wilson to Moosehead Lake, and the Governor with the advice of Council was authorized to appoint, and did appoint Richmond Loring agent to superintend the expenditure of said money—therefore *Resolved*, That the Governor, with advice of Council, be and he hereby is authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasury for such sum as has been expended by virtue of said Resolve, not exceeding the sum of six hundred dollars.

Preamble.

Governor authorized to draw warrant for amount expended.

Chapter 2.

Resolve for the relief of Alexander Thompson.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State, forty-five dollars to Alexander Thompson of Topsham on account of an injury sustained by him while performing military duty.

Alex. Thompson, pension, \$45.

[Approved January 24, 1840.]
