Chapter 7.

Resolve in favor of Jonathan M. Smiley.

J. M. Smiley—
pension, \$100.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State, out of any moneys not otherwise appropriated, to Jonathan M. Smiley, the sum of one hundred dollars, in full remuneration for his time, physician's bill, board and other expenses while in the service of the State as a soldier in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, and while sick in consequence of said service.

Chapter 8.

Resolve in favor of Eleanor Gray.

Eleanor Gray—
pension, \$40.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State, the sum of forty dollars, to Eleanor Gray of Sedgwick, on account of the death of her late husband, Sewall Gray, who died in consequence of a wound received while in the military service of the State.

Chapter 9.

Resolve in favor of C. J. Whiting.

30 stand of arms
to be loaned to
military school at
Ellsworth.

Resolved, That the Governor be, and he hereby is authorized to loan to C. J. Whiting, thirty stand of arms from the State Arsenals for the use of his military school at Ellsworth, upon said Whiting's giving satisfactory security for the return thereof, upon demand in as perfect order as when taken.
